

CHAPTER (1): DISTRICT BACKGROUND INFORMATION

1.1 History:

Kiruhura District Local Government was curved out of greater Mbarara in the year 2005. The District started operating in the Financial Year 2005/06.

1.2 Location:

Kiruhura District is located in the south western region. It is bordered by Kyegegwa District to the North, Sembabule to the North-east, Kamwenge District in the North-west, Lyantonde District to the East, Rakai to the South-east, Isingiro to the South, Mbarara District to the South-west and Ibanda to the North-east.

Kiruhura District is composed of **3** counties, **18** Lower Local Governments (LLGS) whereby **15** are Sub-counties and **3** are Town Councils. There are **91** Parishes and **562** Villages.

Kiruhura District according to the National Population and Housing Census (NPHC) 2014 had a total population of **328,077** people.

The **Males** were <u>166,214</u> and **females** <u>161,863</u> implying a sex ratio of **103**. This shows that in Kiruhura District the Male population is bigger than the Female population (103 males for every 100 females)

The annual population growth rate of Kiruhura District stands at **3.64%**. This is far above **3.0%** which is Uganda's annual Population growth rate.

The projected population for Kiruhura District by end of October 2017 was about 366,587 people.

CHAPTER 2: DISTRIBUTION OF SCHOOLS IN KIRUHURA

Kiruhura has a total of 137 Universal Primary Education (UPE) Schools and 11 Government aided Secondary Schools. The District is partnering with 2 Private secondary schools to implement Universal Secondary Education (USE). The Schools are: Kinoni Community High School in Kinoni Sub-county and Premier High school in Kanoni Sub-county. In the year 2017, 1 Secondary school (Engari Secondary school started operating as a government Secondary School offering USE.

This section presents enrolment information for Government Schools in Kiruhura District.

ENROLMENT INTO UNIVERSAL PRIMARY EDUCATION (UPE)

The enrolment into UPE schools has been growing. The figures for the last 3 years show that UPE enrolment grew by **2,751** between 2015 and 2017. The enrolment sex ratio has remained **98** males for every 100 females for the past three years implying that there are more female pupils enrolled in UPE schools in Kiruhura District. The trend is summarized in the figure below:




Figure 1: UPE enrolment Trend for the last 3 years in Kiruhura District.

The trend shows that Male enrolment increased by 1,371 pupils and for females by 1,380 in the three year period. Substantial increase in enrolment was registered between 2016 and 2017 after closure of sub-standard and illegally operating primary schools.

The enrolment into USE schools has been growing. The figures for the last 3 years show that USE enrolment grew by **1,719** between 2015 and 2017. The enrolment sex ratio has since improved

from **155** to **133** males for every 100 females for the past three years implying that there are more male students enrolled in USE schools in Kiruhura District. This is still a very big gap. The trend is summarized in the figure below:




Figure 2: USE enrollment Trend for the last 3 years in Kiruhura District

The trend shows that Male enrolment increased by **581** students and for females by **681** in the three year period between 2015 and 2017.

Census 2014 showed that 2 in every 10 children who are supposed to be in Primary school (6-12 years) were actually not in School. The total population aged (6-12years) was **64,492** and constituted **19.8%** of the District total population. The projected population aged 6-12) is estimated to be **71,412** children.

Census 2014 showed that **7** in every **10** children who are supposed to be in Secondary school (13-18 years) were actually not in School. The total population aged (13-18years) was **46,652** and constituted **14.2%** of the District total population. From the results in table above there are no marked differentials in school attendance. The projected Population aged (13-18) is estimated to be **51,656** as at end of August 2017.

In Kiruhura District **15** in every **20** households are within a distance of less than five kilometers to the nearest UPE School. Considering both Private and UPE schools, 17 households access a primary school facility within **5** kms. Only **2** in every **10** households access a polic secondary school within a distance of **5** kms. **One** in every **two** households access any Secondary school within a distance of at least 5 kms.
